# Sappho: singer/songwriter of the seventh century BC

Sappho was regarded in the Ancient World as one of the greatest poets in the Greek language, second only to Homer, yet almost nothing survives of her work (about 650 lines out of 10,000). How is it that a highly respected writer's work is almost lost to us? What do the tantalising fragments tell us about her concerns, style and talent? And what is her connection with North Hertfordshire?

# Hitchin Priory: home of monks, monkeys and tyrants

Ever wondered about the story of Hitchin Priory?

What we now call Hitchin Priory has its origins in 1317. Find out about what the site has been used for, and all the plants and animals that have called the Priory home in this evening talk from curator Matt Platt!

You'll explore the buildings and its grounds, touching on some of the interesting figures and events that have shaped its history, as well as getting a closer look at some museum objects that help to tell its story.

# 'Evacuation': the 'How' and 'Why' - Talk by Vera Grigg

An evacuee discusses her experience of the evacuation of London children, for which extensive planning started as early as 1930, before the start of the Second World War. Was it successful?

Vera was born in Dagenham in 1931 and she twice survived being bombed. She was evacuated with her school to East Dereham in Norfolk during the 'phoney war' until her parents brought her home. Vera stayed in Dagenham throughout the war and then went into teaching, both locally and in Inner London. She now lives in Hitchin.

Opera for everyone - Talk by Madeleine McConnell Smith Join British soprano, Madeleine McConnell Smith, for a light-hearted evening introducing opera in its different forms over the centuries.

Through an engaging and informative presentation, including live singing from Madeleine herself, she seeks to demystify the world of opera and foster a deeper appreciation for its beauty and complexity.

Madeleine is originally from Letchworth Garden City and has just finished her Masters in Music, specialising in classical vocal performance, at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance. She has a wealth of performing experience and alongside this has been a vocal teacher with Hertfordshire Music Service for four years.

#### **Hitchin's Toy Story**

'Raffo, Pape & Woodward' with their team of inventive designers quietly created and developed product concepts for the children's toy industry from their design studio in Hitchin.

For over 40 years, their designs have been manufactured and sold through major companies like Fisher Price, Tomy, Playskool and Matchbox. Projects include work on brands such as Action Man, Play Doh, and Thomas the Tank Engine.

This family-friendly exhibition, 'Hitchin's Toy Story', features a colourful display of original artworks, videos, production toy samples and prototype models from their portfolio to date.


