

## Darkness from light: the origins of Gothic literature

The enlightenment bred reason, rationality and the Gothic, a literary genre steeped in darkness.

This talk will look at the inception of the Gothic in the context of the French Revolution, societal anxieties and cultural fashions. It will look at Horace Walpole's *The Castle of Otranto* (1764) as the first Gothic novel, before considering other early examples, including works by Anne Radcliffe, Charlotte Dacre and Matthew Lewis.

#### Transforming Monsters: How the literature of terror still speaks to us today

In 1974, Angela Carter, the 'high sorceress' of English literature, declared: "We live in gothic times".

Each decade since, Gothic academics and social commentators alike have continued to find validity in this statement. But what is contemporary Gothic?

This talk will build on ideas from the previous talk 'Darkness from light: the origins of Gothic literature'. However

you do not need to have attended that talk to enjoy this one.


# The Heraclian Dynasty ('the seventh century')

17 September 7.30pm

Heraclius I rose against Phocas in 610 and established one of the empire's longest lasting dynasties. It had the misfortune to see the rise of the Arab states after the foundation of Islam, losing the Levant and North Africa to them, and the transformation of the Empire from an urban dominated Late Antique society to a medieval agrarian state resembling the kingdoms that were becoming the norm across Europe. Like so many Roman dynasties, it fell with the execution of its last member, Justinian II in 711.

# Aftermath: from the Isaurian Dynasty to the fall of the Empire 15 October 7.30pm

The history of the Empire from Leo III to Constantine XI, AD 717-1453, is often seen as one of long, inevitable decline. This is far from true: there were periods of considerable success and resurgence, but the Crusaders' sack of Constantinople in 1204 was the beginning of the end. However, the Ottoman conqueror of Constantinople, Mehmet II. saw himself as the successor emperor, a claim recognised by the Patriarch of Constantinople and the Ming Emperors of China; the rulers of Moscow from Ivan III Vasilyevich, husband of Constantine XI's niece, also claimed the title.

# 28 March – 28 June 2026 Dinosaurium: Reimagined Creatures
